

REGULATIONS ON THE ACTIVITIES OF HUMAN RESPONSIBILITY DAY AMBASSADORS

1. PREAMBLE

The Bohdan Hawrylyshyn Family Foundation's mission is to support changemakers in building a values-driven Ukraine. Founded on values such as responsibility, cooperation, and professionalism, and with faith in Ukraine's high potential, the Foundation develops and implements programs for active Ukrainians to educate, inspire, and provide them with opportunities for growth.

A key area of the Foundation's and the Human Responsibility Day Ambassadors' activities is the promotion of the principles of human responsibilities through the Declaration of Human Responsibilities, created in 2014 by the renowned Ukrainian economist, visionary, and co-founder of the World Economic Forum in Davos, Bohdan Hawrylyshyn. The Declaration includes 15 principles that offer a comprehensive view of responsibility as a value that influences person's individual and professional development, as well as relationships with the community and actions toward the country and the world.

1. Speak the truth, be honest, and act according to moral and ethical principles.
2. Maintain your health in the best possible condition to avoid burdening society with the costs of your treatment.
3. Learn, develop your talents, abilities, and skills throughout your life to be a useful part of society.
4. Treat others as you would like to be treated.
5. Be a free person, i.e., be the judge of what is true or false, good or evil. At the same time, continue to test your judgment to ensure it aligns with moral and ethical principles.
6. Strive for harmony between your personal, professional, and social life as part of the community.
7. In pursuing your rights, do not infringe on the rights of others in society.
8. Solve as many problems and issues as possible at the individual, family, and community levels to ease the burden and reduce the costs of governance.
9. A person's responsibilities to their family:
 - Preserve the cultural heritage of your ancestors;
 - Treat your parents with love and respect, and help them if needed;
 - Treat your siblings as your best friends.
10. Parents' responsibilities to their children:
 - Love your children, instill ethical and moral values in them;
 - Encourage their education and development of talents and personalities, raising them as free people.
11. Responsibilities to society:
 - Help society be effective in providing services such as primary education, healthcare, and social services;
 - Promote the welfare of all members of society;
 - While preserving your identity, be a conscious part of the global community.
12. Responsibilities to the environment:
 - Use all resources wisely and economically, avoid polluting the biosphere. Help preserve biological and zoological diversity.
13. Responsibilities to the country:
 - Abide by the law;
 - Help your country within your means to prioritize the common good: complete political freedom, adequate economic well-being for the entire population, social justice, and a healthy environment.

14. Responsibilities to future generations:

- Leave the environment in better condition than you found it: with increased cultural heritage and values, to enable future generations to be more effective in the political, economic, social, and cultural spheres of society.

15. Responsibilities to the world:

- Be tolerant and respectful of all races, ethnic groups, religions, languages, and customs;
- Learn different languages and at least basic facts about other civilizations;
- Promote understanding of different cultures and their values for peaceful cooperation and fair trade.

2. GENERAL PROVISIONS

2.1. These Regulations of the Bohdan Hawrylyshyn Family Foundation on the activities of Human Responsibility Day Ambassadors (hereinafter referred to as Ambassadors) define the areas of cooperation, rights, duties, tasks, and goals for the Ambassadors and the Foundation.

2.2. Ambassadorship of Human Responsibility Day involves representing and promoting the principles of human responsibilities in Ukraine and abroad, assisting in the implementation of thematic events, engaging the media, partners, and active individuals within the framework of spreading the principles of human responsibility in their country of residence.

2.3. The goal of the Human Responsibility Day Ambassadorship is to promote the principles of human responsibility and the idea of Human Responsibility Day to the international community.

2.4. The Human Responsibility Day Ambassadorship is voluntary and adheres to principles of openness and cooperation.

3. ACTIVITIES OF THE AMBASSADORS

3.1. The primary task of the Ambassadors is to promote the principles of human responsibilities, the idea of Human Responsibility Day, and to assist the Foundation in fulfilling its mission according to mutually agreed areas of activity.

3.2. Goals are determined jointly by the Ambassadors and the Foundation according to the areas of activity.

3.3. Areas of activity for the Ambassadors: a) Promoting the principles of responsibility as outlined in the Declaration of Human Responsibility in their country of residence; b) Advocating for the implementation of Human Responsibility Day in their country of residence; c) Assisting in the promotion of a petition to implement Human Responsibility Day in Europe and globally; d) Networking activities focused on familiarizing and discussing the principles of human responsibility (meetings, discussions, workshops, roundtables with civic leaders in the country of residence); e) Collaboration with the media (highlighting the principles of human responsibility, stories about the Declaration of Human Responsibility and Bohdan Hawrylyshyn, the establishment of Human Responsibility Day in Ukraine, successful cases of Ukrainians in local media, etc.); f) Building partnerships to implement projects that promote the principles of human responsibility in the country of residence; g) Other areas of activity proposed by the Ambassador and/or the Foundation.

3.4. Ambassadors may be alumni of one of the Foundation's programs and/or willing civic activists:

- Who resonate with the values embedded in the Declaration of Human Responsibility and the idea of establishing Human Responsibility Day worldwide;
- Who are fluent in Ukrainian and English;
- Who possess strong communication and presentation skills;
- Who share the values and principles of the Foundation's activities;
- Who believe in positive change in Ukraine and hold an active civic position.

3.5. The activities of the Ambassadors commence upon gaining Ambassador status (completion of the selection process and official announcement of the results) and continue for one year.

3.6. The status of an Ambassador may be extended by the decision of the Foundation's head.

3.7. In the case of non-fulfillment of representative functions and/or violation of the Foundation's principles, the Foundation's board reserves the right to prematurely terminate the Ambassador's status.

3.8. Ambassadors are selected by the Foundation's team and approved by the Foundation's head based on a completed application form.

4. COOPERATION AND MUTUAL OBLIGATIONS

4.1. The relationship between the Ambassadors and the Foundation is based on voluntary principles, openness, cooperation, and responsibility.

4.2. Ambassadors may:

- Represent the program's idea and the Ambassador community in their country of residence;
- Unite young leaders around the principles of human responsibility in their country of residence;
- Spread Bohdan Hawrylyshyn's Declaration of Human Responsibility;
- Organize exhibitions of illustrations related to the Declaration of Human Responsibility;
- Initiate an advocacy campaign for the implementation of Human Responsibility Day in their country of residence;
- Build value-based partnerships to spread the principles of human responsibility in their country of residence;
- Promote the creation of a petition to the European Parliament for the implementation of Human Responsibility Day in the European Union;
- Share successful Ukrainian cases that illustrate the principles of responsibility;
- Provide suggestions for improving the activities of Ambassadors and interaction with the Foundation, and more.

4.3. In their cooperation, Ambassadors must:

- Meet the criteria according to paragraph 3.4 of these Regulations;
- Choose one or more priority areas of Ambassadorship (paragraph 3.3);
- Coordinate potential partnerships with the Foundation;
- Inform the Foundation about potential meetings, presentations, events, etc.;
- Attend coordination online meetings of Ambassadors;
- Create or assist in creating social media posts about Ambassadorship and the principles of human responsibility, Bohdan Hawrylyshyn, Human Responsibility Day in Ukraine, etc.

4.4. The Foundation may:

- Propose an activity plan for the Ambassadors;
- Outline priority tasks for the Ambassadors' activities;
- Approach Ambassadors with its own cooperation proposals in their country of residence;
- Revoke the Ambassador's status according to paragraph 3.7 of the Regulations.

4.5. The Foundation undertakes to:

- Provide Ambassadors with all necessary presentation and communication materials;
- Organize and maintain communication between Ambassadors and the Foundation;
- Respond promptly to the Ambassadors' proposals, requests, and appeals;
- Facilitate participation in Foundation events in Ukraine and abroad;
- Provide recommendation letters to Ambassadors;
- Create a space for experience exchange and personal network building;
- Support Ambassadors with information on social media.

5. FINAL PROVISIONS

5.1. The activities of the Ambassadors are based on voluntary principles and do not provide for direct funding for their activities.

5.2. The Foundation's team strives to create a space of support and mutual understanding among program participants, the community, and the Foundation's partners. Therefore, any misunderstandings between the Foundation and Ambassadors are resolved based on the principles
